**Toter Carts and Solid Waste Time of Col**lection-Residents are reminded solid waste containers (or Toters) may not remain on the parking or terrace of the street in front of a premise for more than 12 hours after the date designated for solid waste. Toter cart owners may be fined for carts that are left out after collection day. For habitual violators, the carts may be confiscated. Place your Toter cart and other materials to be collected such as yard wastes and recyclables at your designated collection location no later than 6:30 a.m. on your scheduled collection day and no earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the day before your scheduled collection.

If the lid to your Toter cart has gone bad, you can get a free replacement by calling the Des Moines Public Works Department at 283-4950. You will need to give them an address and arrange a time when you can leave the cart out where they can get to it to replace the lid. It doesn't matter if the lid was abused, or went bad from weather or whatever reason.

Recently, a group that lives in the Union Park and Capitol Park area met with a Des Moines planner. The City plans to clear the area and provide mulch. A small (but mighty) crew of volunteers is needed to help the city workers (sometime in the near future on a weekday Monday-Friday 8-4:30). Then take the "wait and see" approach. The Tree of Heaven will need to be monitored until gone. A big concern is maintenance. A prairie takes a lot of time and work to get it established. There is a lot of square footage so there is room for a variety of plants and ideas. Maybe planting fruit trees, or turning it into a perennial plant orphanage, maybe someone will donate a great ground cover and maybe that can be done in combination with something else. "Crime Mapping" Tool-An online crime mapping tool on the City of Des Moines Website allows residents to easily access information about their own neighborhoods, areas where they spend time or even the areas around potential new homes. Crime Mapping is available to search for crime statistics and compare other parts of the City of Des Moines. Crime Mapping allows users to search an area near a specific address and inquire by type of crime and date. To use the program, go to www.crimemapping.com. Click on Iowa, then on Des Moines police. Use the tabs to specify the crime types, dates, address and radius you'd like to search. Click on individual symbols on the map for information on the incident or look at overall reports for your search. The service is free for the public. An iPhone app is also available.
