## **Archer Daniels Midland Increases Production**


A public meeting is scheduled for October 15 at 6:30 p.m. at the Hy-Vee Euclid Room. The Euclid Room is the building adjacent to the Hy-Vee Store located at 2540 E. Euclid Ave. Officials involved in the permitting process will meet with neighbors to discuss health risks from the increased toxic emissions and particulates that will be associated with the increase in production at the Archer Daniels Midland soybean processing plant located at 1935 E. Euclid AVE. It is expected that ADM, Iowa Department of Natural Resources and Polk County Health Department will be represented at the meeting.

ADM applied for the permit to increase production in March 2015. A public comment period ran from August 12, 2015 to September 11, 2015. A public hearing was scheduled for September 9th, however it did not come to the attention of neighborhood leaders until early that day, which gave little time to react. Although all the proper guidelines were followed, neighbors feel they did not have adequate notice to provide timely feedback on the plans. An extension of the 30 notice was

not granted. Questions that were submitted in writing to DNR before the end of the public comment period have not yet been answered.

In addition to nearby businesses and residential neighborhoods, Garton Elementary School and Luther Park Senior Living community is less than a mile from the plant.

This meeting is intended to be an information meeting and participants are encouraged to be civil and respectful to the speakers. This event is sponsored by Douglas Acres Neighborhood Association and Northeast Neighbors and Friends.





Smart911 as Enhanced Public Safety Service - Public safety officials in the Polk County E911 service area encourage citizens to create a Safety Profile for faster and more effective emergency response. This is a free service that is now available. Smart911 is a national service that allows citizens to create a free Safety Profile for their household that includes any information they want 9-1-1 and first responders to have in the event of an emergency. If that citizen needs to dial 9-1-1, their Safety Profile will immediately display on the call taker's screen, saving seconds and even minutes in response to the emergency.

Citizens can visit www.smart911.com to sign up and create a free Safety Profile for their household, providing information such as the names and photos of family members, health conditions, medications, pets in the home, vehicle details and emergency contacts. All information in each profile is voluntary, and each household can determine what details are important to include, as each household is different and therefore the potential rescue needs will also vary.

Simple details can help during an emergency. Knowing the access points to the home, whether there is a pet to be aware of when approaching or entering the home or just knowing the name of the person in distress can enhance the safety of citizens and officers alike.

Smart911 will give 9-1-1 call takers the ability to send the appropriate response teams to the right location and with more information.

"We often spend the first few minutes during an emergency gathering information and assessing the scene," said Des Moines Fire Department Inspector Brian O'Keefe. "By having this information, such as photos of family members, details of those who may need evacuation assistance and even utility shut off locations, while we are en route we can begin our on scene efforts more quickly."

Citizens are encouraged to sign up for Smart911 and create a Safety Profile at <a href="www.smart911.com">www.smart911.com</a> to ensure 9-1-1 will have access to their information during an emergency. Smart911 is private and secure, and is only made available to 9-1-1 when an emergency call is made.

# Planter at "The Steps"

Update on the planter at "The Steps" in Union Park. Perennials were planted in May. An employee of the Parks and Recreation Department said it is a "butterfly garden" and contains such plants as dill and butterfly milkweed. Benches have been purchased and this will make a shady and cool place to sit and watch the butterflies. The Des Moines Park and Recreation Department selects the plants and maintains the planter. UPNA applied for the Community Development Grant, to design and build the sidewalk, planter and purchase benches.



## A New Tree in Honor of Bill and Nellie Richie

THANK YOU to Marsha Steele for accomplishing the planting of a Concolor fir in Union Park on Wednesday in honor of Bill and Nellie Richie. Bill's favorite way of beautifying his neighborhood and city was to plant trees along the streets, in parks, and by schools and churches. When Bill passed away in April 2007, his obituary stated that he raised funds to plant over 500 new trees in the Union Park area. Nellie was always by his side and both were founders and officers of UPNA. In the weeks to come, Steering Committee members will help keep the tree watered until the first frost.

Also a shelter near the Heritage Carousel was renamed in honor of Bill and Nellie. Good job, UPNA, in remembering two wonderful people!



### Little Libraries

Little Libraries are available through Northeast Neighbors and Friends to anyone who would like to have one in their yard. About ten of these are currently scattered in neighborhoods on the northeast side. If you would like one in your yard, now is the time to reserve one and get that post in the ground before it gets cold. The libraries themselves are small weatherproof glass-front boxes on a post in front yards near the sidewalk. Adults and children are encouraged to stop and take a book to read and/or put a book in it for someone else to read. All exchanges are free and the goal

is to provide free books to anyone to promote reading.



#### SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

To help ensure that sidewalks are safe during the winter, City ordinance requires residents to remove snow and ice from sidewalks within 48 hours following the end of the snowfall. Property owners who do not comply are subject to a civil citation. A helpful hint for residents on snow routes – clear your sidewalk after the snowplows have finished plowing to the curb. When you remove snow from your driveway or sidewalk, please remember that City ordinance prohibits placing snow on any public street, sidewalk, or rightof-way.
