



What's Happening in Birdland?

We all remember the devastation to the Birdland area during the floods of 1993 and 2008. The community of 270 homes was reduced to 54 homes. Since then, the levee has been rebuilt and certified by the Army Corps of Engineers. Now things are happening in the Birdland Area.

During April 26-29th, the area literally swarmed with volunteers for the Greater Des Moines Habitat for Humanity (GDMH) "Rock the Block". Low income residents received assistance with needed repair, maintenance, weatherization, safety, accessibility, and beautification of homes.

Beginning the week of May 15-20 GDMH will construct ten houses in a one-week blitz along Watson Avenue in the Birdland area. The blitz will end the week of June 12-16 with a dedication ceremony on June 17th.

If you would like to be a GDMH volunteer and part of this revitalization of the Birdland area, you can sign up through the Habitat website at gdmhabitat.org/volunteer or con-

tact them at volunteer@gdmhabitat.org.

HOME, Inc. (Home Opportunities Made Easy, Inc) is building 6 houses this year in the same area. HOME, Inc. is the oldest private, non-profit housing organization in Des Moines whose mission is to create opportunities for quality, affordable housing. HOME, Inc. develops affordable housing, and provides both rental and home ownership counseling and education.

In the fall of 2017, GDMH will create a "pocket neighborhood" of at least 18 single family homes in the Birdland neighborhood, the first of its kind in the state.

On the other side of the levee, near the Birdland Marina, you can see Captain Roy's Allis Chalmers orange food truck with blue wheels. This unique pit stop serves American Food to Union Park residents, boaters at Birdland Marina and thousands of cyclists that pass by on the Neal Smith Trail. Service started in March and a bar will open yet this

spring. Soon it will also have a supply shop for bikers and live music.

The Des Moines Rowing Club also rents space at Birdland Marina. They continue to make improvements to their facility and provides and maintains the docks for rowers use as well as community use. The club has adopted the shoreline around the Birdland Marina area to help with neighborhood beautification efforts.

The Union Park Neighborhood Association leveraged some grants to improve the "Stone Bridge" where many cars a day cross over the Birdland Lagoon on Birdland Drive. Concrete steps and handrail now make it easier for fishermen to access a small pad they can enjoy the sport.

damage in young children. Low interest loans, forgivable loans or grants are available The Polk County's Lead Repair Program has completed Lead Abatement work on 6 homes for the 1st quarter of 2017.


Graffiti!

Things have changed with graffiti. Apparently, requirements have changed and there no longer is a 24 hour Graffiti Hotline. If you get hit and believe the graffiti is vandalism or a gang sign, it should be reported immediately to Sharon K. Neff at 515-248-6350. Or even better, take a picture and send it to her at SKNeff@dmgov.org

If it is a gang sign, you don't want

your property to be "marked" as gang territory and it is called a "tag". For every po-

tential tag that is called in or e-mailed to any City employee or observed by any City employee, Sharon is their contact person. She will have someone locate, take a picture and send to contacts in the Police Department. A Police case number will be issued only if the owner requests one



from the Police. After that, the tag will be covered up, typically with white paint. If it is on an unpainted structure, siding, etc., it will be power washed to remove it. If it is a structure in good condition the owner may opt to provide the matching paint to cover the affected area.
