## Bicycle Events in Union Park



Some shelters are available for reservation while others are "first come, first serve" shelters. ## Riviera Stage at Riverview

The Riviera Stage at Riverview Island came one step closer on July 14 when The Parks Area Foundation Riviera Stage Project was recognized at a luncheon at Prairie Meadows. Polk County Supervisors announced their grant of \$250,000 to the Parks Area Foundation, to aid in the construction costs of the Riviera Stage on Riverview Island. The stage is expected to cost \$1 million to build. Through generous donations and grants, about ¾ of the needed money has been raised. Construction is expected to start this fall or next spring. The "Riviera Stage" is a nod to the Riviera Ballroom which was built on the Riverview Island in 1940 which was destroyed by fire in 1981. The design of the stage echoes the rails of the rollercoaster at Riverview Park. Riverview Island is under the Des Moines Park and Recreation Department system. Once the stage is built, it will be gifted to the City of Des Moines.

Riverview Amusement Park was in operation from 1915-1978. The idea of an amusement park on the island sprang up from a visit to Coney Island by Abe Frankle. At first it had a roller coaster, swimming pool and a dance pavilion. After it was sold to Adventureland in 1978, it stagnated and declined. Thanks to the Parks Area Foundation, plans were made for a master revitalization project to redevelop Riverview Park into a new public space and entertainment venue. Their focus became neighborhood improvement, cultural preservation, educational opportunities and an attractive family space & entertainment venue. ### STAR PLAYGROUND AT RIVERVIEW PARK

Variety-The Children's Charity announced on July 14th they will begin work on its newest all-inclusive Star Playground in Des Moines located at Riverview Park. The Polk County Board of Supervisors kicked off the campaign with \$50,000 grant.

The Variety Star Playground at Riverview Park will be ramped for accessibility, have a poured in place rubber surface and will provide opportunities for children and adults of all abilities to interact together through play. The playground will include shade canopies, play structures to promote core strength, harnessed swings, a saucer swing that allows children to lay flat to experience sensation of swinging and other additional features.

Variety elected to build the Star Playground at Riverview Park because of the park's centralized location and because it is currently the focus of a revitalization effort. This larger project will transform the park with the addition of an entertainment stage and shelter. Variety hopes the Star Playground project will infuse additional excitement and energy into the park overhaul. Upon completion, the playground will be gifted to the city of Des Moines. Des Moines Parks and Recreation department will be responsible for maintenance and upkeep. Ground breaking is planned for spring 2018.

Variety has secured its lead gift through a generous grant from the Polk County Board of Supervisors. Additional funding will be sought through grants, corporate donations and individual gifts. Variety believes that playgrounds should be thrilling for all children! Providing a playground for children of all abilities to play together helps promote play, healthy physical activity and learning for all children. Outdoor play experiences provide the perfect opportunity to support inclusive play by creating awareness, breaking down barriers and fostering friendships.



### **SCRUB Days: 3rd Saturdays of Each Month**

The last SCRUB event for residents to get rid of junk, appliances, and yard debris is November 18th. SCRUB events are free to the citizens of Des Moines, therefore you may experience longer wait times based on participation.

Take junk/appliances to: MWA Transfer Station, 4198 Delaware Ave - 7 AM - 2 PM Take yard waste to: MWA Compost Center, 1601 Harriett - 7 AM - 2 PM

SCRUB (Spring Cleanup to Remove Urban Blight) Guidelines:

Residents of Des Moines ONLY: Proof of residency is required; Photo ID or current utility bill

No Commercial Haulers: Commercial Haulers MUST use landfill

Make sure your vehicle has plenty of gas. Disabled vehicles create delays

Vehicle Requirements: Cars, pickups and small trailers are preferred. Large trailers MUST be sponsored by neighborhoods.

Unloading Procedures: Ask where to unload

Plan to unload your own vehicle within 15 minutes. If you will not be able to unload by yourself in 15 minutes, bring additional help to assist you!

Place all items as directed. Clean up you own mess.

Scavenging/salvaging is NOT permitted at anytime.

## **Gold Level Recycling Program**

You may have noticed some of your neighbors have a yellow or "gold" lid on their blue recycling Toter. They are SUPER RECYCLERS and they have been rewarded with a Gold Lid for placing the correct recyclables into the blue carts.

When the wrong items are placed in the blue recycling Toter, and makes it to the recycling stream, the contamination costs us \$10,000 a month. Unfortunately almost twenty percent of the blue bins are trash that should go to the landfill. Many people do not know what can be recycled or are simply careless. A list of forbidden/banned items that should NOT be placed in your recycle Toter is on the Public Works website at

www.dmgov.org/DEPARTMENTS/ PUBLICWORKS

You can nominate yourself or your neighbor to achieve the Gold Level by going the Public Works website to register for a recycling audit. The City of Des Moines Recycling personnel will check the contents of the cart on your prescribed recycling day and determine if it

qualifies to be on the 'Gold Level'. Then another Public Works employee will swap out your old blue lid for a new Gold Lid. The Toter must be at the curb for him to do that, so don't be in a rush to

haul it back in if you have requested an audit.

The Gold Lids cost
Public Works the same
as the blue ones but it is
like getting a gold star
for those who doing a
good job. Every item
that can be recycled
that doesn't go to the
landfill is a value to citizens, the environment
and the community at
large. Turn your recyclables into treasure.
Gold Lids are awarded
to Super Recyclers!



## Get Paid to Improve Your Property

This program can help property owners pay the cost of materials and labor for a variety of improvements including foundation drains, sump pump redirections, roof drain disconnections and backwater valve installation. The key elements of the program require:


- 1 A maximum of a \$1,000 subsidy for 50% of the cost of materials and labor for qualified improvements to existing structures.
- 2. Improvement must be to an existing home (does not apply to new construction).
- 3. Work must have been completed no later than June 30, 2023.
- 4. Items of work deemed eligible are:
- a. Installation of a backwater valve or sump pump.
- b. disconnection of roof leaders from the sanitary sewer service.
- c. installation or redirection of a sump pump to discharge flows from foundation drains and area drains to a non-sanitary sewer outlet, such as a rain garden, storm sewer or the ground surface.
- 5. You must complete an application and have been approved for the incentive prior to any work being started. Once work is completed; you must turn in itemized receipts to qualify for the incentive.
- 6 Work must be performed by a licensed plumber.

7. The account for the sanitary sewer fee charges on the property must be current in payments at the time of application.

Applications to the Department of Public Works will be accepted until June 1, 2023. For more information, visit dmgov.org or call the Public Works 24-Hour Customer Service Center at 515-283-4950.

First photo shows a roof drain emptying at the base of a house. Second photo shows drain connected to direct the water away from the foundation.





## Continued Improvement of Our Neighborhoods


Des Moines Community Development Department has begun the process to update its Neighborhood Revitalization Program (NRP). It was last updated in 2005. A consulting firm has been contracted to lead the update.

Topics to be addressed in the new NRP include:

- \* The current planning process and its effectiveness
- \* Conditions of the neighborhoods
- \* How PlanDSM, the City's comprehensive plan, and updates to the zoning code will shape neighborhood revitalization efforts.

Then recommendations will be made regarding the neighborhood designation process, managing blighted structures within the NRP strategy, and prioritizing streetscape or corridor projects.

Past successes of the NRP have included the creation of the Neighborhood Finance Corporation, Neighborhood Development Corporation and the Polk County Housing Trust Fund. The program maintains partnerships with neighborhood associations, residents, and businesses advocating change. Last year, the city leveraged approximately \$4 million in housing projects throughout Des Moines. Renewing the NRP will bring more resources to enhance Des Moines' neighborhoods.



## Package and Mail Thefts

More people are ordering things on-line and the packages are delivered to front steps and porches especially during the holiday season. Unfortunately there has been an increase in stolen packages reported. Des Moines Police detectives have solved some of those thefts with the help of cameras in the victim's homes. The thefts have slowed down, but criminals who were successful will continue to attempt to do this. Officers and detectives are aware of the various methods used by criminals and are always looking out while on patrol to curtail the thefts.

To reduce your chances of being a victim of this type of crime, in the future, here are some things you could do:

Have the package delivered to a neighbor you know and trust – someone who will be home during the day to accept it for you.

Have the delivery person leave the package only if they personally deliver it to a resident in the home. Check that you want a signature for the item. That way they cannot just drop it and go.

Another option is to have the package delivered to a back door so it is not sitting out where anyone driving by can see it, stop, and grab it. Although if the criminal is following the delivery truck, they will still see the delivery, so this method is the least secure, but is an option nonetheless.

If you believe you have become a victim of package or mail theft, call police dispatch and make a police report at 515-283-4811.

Grass clippings in City Streets Create
Problems: Grass clipping and other yard

debris can clog the city's storm sewer intakes causing street flooding, therefore the City is reminding residents and landscape companies that an administrative fine may be issued for blowing or raking grass clipping and leaves into a public street. The fine is \$50 for the first offense, \$75 for the second offense within the same year and \$100 for the third offense.

Solid waste containers (collection carts or "Toters"): All collection carts should be placed curbside by 7:00 am and no earlier than 5:00 pm the day before scheduled collection. Remove all carts from the curb within 12 hours after collection. If for some reason your garbage was not collected, you may call Public Works 24-Hour Customer Service Center at 283-4950.

Electrical Outages: When the lights go out, be sure to report your outage to MidAmerican Energy and encourage your neighbors to call. If you don't let them know, they may not know there is a problem and the sooner they know, the quicker the problem can be resolved. Call 800-799-4443 to report an outage. www.midamericanenergy.com/outages-storms.aspx. When reporting an outage on line, you will be asked for the telephone number and address for the account where the outage is occurring. You may be asked if you want to be notified of the progress and estimated time power will be restored.

Show me my house: This online mapping and info system is a one-stop shop for every property owner. Type your address and instantly view a report that shows trash and recycling pick-up day, city council rep info, zoning rules, census data and a wealth of other customized information. The city won a national award in 2013 for the innovative tool.
