

This beautiful car has custom green and cream paint with a detailed and artistic stripe separating these colors. Gary says he has "completely redone the entire car". The interior is all new, and it is powered by a new and updated Chevy motor, new drive train and "all the modern conveniences" Gary says. These updates are for the comfort and safety of the Pullens who drive this car to weekend shows from late spring through mid-autumn. The Pullens have deep roots on the East side and continue to live here. In addition, Gary is a founding member of the Concrete Cruisers car club, a popular club in the Des Moines area.



Each year, the Rollin' Relics Car Club sponsors the Cruise to the Carousel car show. It is an important annual fund raiser for the Heritage Carousel at Union Park, which helps keep the rides for children at 50 cents each. UPNA provided a trophy recognizing our neighborhood choice for one of the outstanding cars at the show. Enthusiasm at this year's show was not diminished in the least by a light morning drizzle and heavy overcast sky. A very diverse group of about 180 carefully and lovingly restored cars were displayed in the park near the Carousel. The show raised a significant donation to support the Carousel again this year, which will be announced at a later date. We hope to see another large group of cars, owners, and car enthusiasts at the show again next year!

The Views Forward Project

Grand View University has been a proud and committed resident of the east side of Des Moines since its founding in 1896. Campus improvements in the last decade have enhanced the University's footprint along East 14th Street and surrounding streets. THE VIEWS FORWARD PROJECT recognizes the impact the University has had on the neighborhood and aims to bring continued positive change through genuine and sustainable projects, programs and events that involve residents and businesses.

THE VIEWS FORWARD PROJECT will work with neighborhood leaders representing Highland Park, Union Park, Capitol Park and Martin Luther King, Jr. Park Neighborhood Associations to identify and develop initiatives that meet community needs and expand opportunities for Grand View students to serve, learn, and build ties to the east side of Des Moines.

THE VIEWS FORWARD PROJECT inaugural activities:

Viking Ticket Program: Grand View will give away 1896 tickets to sporting events, theater and music performances during the 2017-2018 school year to neighbors. Tickets can be requested via the Grand View website, www.grandview.edu/views-forward.

Neighborhood Advisory Committee: THE VIEWS FORWARD PROJECT will bring neighborhood leaders together for planning sessions to gather input and provide feedback on VIEWS FORWARD project planning. The Neighborhood Advisory Committee will also serve as a forum for local leaders to share news and discuss common concerns.

Neighborhood volunteerism: Grand View staff, faculty and students contribute more than 56,000 hours of community service each year. THE VIEWS FORWARD PROJECT will begin to focus the power of our volunteer efforts within our neighborhood.

Taking it to the streets: Grand View staff and faculty held dozens of neighborhood meetings earlier this year as we crafted the VIEWS FORWARD PROJECT. Those

meetings highlighted needs and opportunities. To keep the lines of communication open, President Kent Henning will go door-to-door this fall to meet with students living off-campus and their neighbors to learn more about our impact in the community.

THE VIEWS FORWARD PRO-

JECT is a long-term commitment by Grand View to its neighborhood. New initiatives will be launched throughout the year as we work to identify projects and initiatives that meet the needs of our community.

JUST 2 More SCRUB Days For This Year

The last SCRUB Day events for residents to get rid of junk, appliances, and yard debris are October 21 and November 18th. SCRUB events are the 3rd Saturdays of each Month and are free to the citizens of Des Moines. You may experience longer wait times based on participation.

Take junk/appliances to: MWA Transfer Station, 4198 Delaware Ave - 7 AM - 2 PM Take yard waste to: MWA Compost Center, 1601 Harriett - 7 AM - 2 PM

SCRUB (Spring Cleanup to Remove Urban Blight) Guidelines:

Residents of Des Moines ONLY: Proof of residency is required; Photo ID or current utility bill

No Commercial Haulers: Commercial Haulers MUST use landfill

Make sure your vehicle has plenty of gas. Disabled vehicles create delays

Vehicle Requirements: Cars, pickups and small trailers are preferred. Large trailers MUST be sponsored by neighborhoods.

Unloading Procedures: Ask where to unload

Plan to unload your own vehicle within 15 minutes. If you will not be able to unload by yourself in 15 minutes, bring additional help to assist you!

Place all items as directed. Clean up you own mess.

Scavenging/salvaging is NOT permitted at anytime.

Some DO'S and DON'TS For Fall and Winter

DO! Report street lights that are not working. Call 1-888-427-5632. or here is the link to report it:

DO! Clear your sidewalks of snow and ice within 48 hours following the end of snowfall. Property owners who do not comply are subject to a civil citation. Clear your sidewalk after the snowplows have finished plowing to the curb. Private property owners may be fined a municipal infraction that carries a fine up to \$250 for the first offence. Subsequent violations can be up to \$500.

DO! Report sidewalks that are not cleared of snow and ice accumulations. You may call 283-4950 and report the address of the sidewalk. You are not asked to identify yourself.

DO! License all dogs and cats. Six months old and over must be licensed and are due January 1st of each year. Additional penalty fee is added after March 31. Unlicensed cats and dogs may be ticketed. There is a limit of six (6) dogs/cats per household; with not more than 3 being dogs, however, you may request a waiver for a fourth dog if it meets certain requirements. DO! Report Potholes. The city of Des Moines prides themselves on quick response to potholes that have been reported. Just call Public Works at 283-4950 or report them on-line at http://www.dmgov.org/InteractiveForms/.

DO! Renew your UPNA membership on January 1st

DO! Replace the lid on your Solid Waste Toter carts if it is missing or damaged. It is free. Call DM Public Works at 283-4950 to give them your address. You will need to leave the cart out where they can get to it to replace the lid. It doesn't matter if it was abused or went bad from the weather or whatever reason.

DO! Keep your garage doors closed and never leave anything out you don't want to lose. It only invites thefts.

DO NOT! Park on residential streets after snowfalls of 2 inches or more. Snow removal on residential streets citywide begins when the snow ends. Parking will be restricted until residential streets are plowed curb to curb. The cost of a ticket for parking during restrictions is \$35.

DO NOT! Blow leaves, grass clippings or debris of any kind into the street. Grass clipping and other yard debris can clog the city's storm sewer intakes causing street flooding. An administrative fine may be issued. \$50 the first offense, \$75 for the second and \$100 for the third.

DO NOT! Leave your Solid Waste Toter Carts out for more than 12 hours after the date designated for collection. They may be placed out for pick-up no earlier than 5:00 p.m. on the day before but no later than 6:30 a.m. on the day of your scheduled collection.

DO NOT! Put snow into the street. When shoveling out the mouth of your driveway, throw the snow to the right or left, but NOT in the street. Please remember that City ordinance prohibits placing snow on any public street, sidewalk, or right-of- way.
